

THE GERMAN SHORT-HAIRED POINTER

This dog is fast gaining popularity and making itself felt amongst dog lovers and the shooting fraternity of Australia as the all purpose gun dog, the rough shooters' companion and a true and loyal member of the home and family.

The Germans established this breed many, many years ago when they carried out a very strict breeding programme to achieve what we have today.

The over-all picture is portrayed by the standards of the breed; that of an aristocratic, well-balanced and symetrical animal with conformation which indicates power, endurance and agility, intelligence and animation.

He is a dual purpose Pointer-Retriever and this accounts for his excellence in the field, which requires a very keen nose, perserverance in searching and enterprise. His style attracts attention. He is equally good on land or in the water, is biddable, an entremely keen worker and very loval.

He is taking his place in the show ring and creating quite an interest among Handlers and Judges. Already five have become Australian champions, one of which is also Retrieving Trial Champion and another has qualified in C.D. class obedience.

Some very good and promising dogs are showing up in the trials and we sincerely hope that the Handlers continue to work their dogs in these fields.





TRAINING CLASSES FOR RETRIEVING HANDLERS:



Few of us have the rich and cherished memories of such good old days, and I am sure Laurie could fill a book with his, "These were the days of Bullock Teams, Sledges, Horses, Spring Carts, Drays, Muzzle Loaders and various breeds of Dogs, not forgetting plenty of Game, Ducks, Quail, Rabbits, 'roos, Wallabies, Turkeys and many more. When a bag of Quail was referred to as Ten Brace, and wild Turkeys were hunted with Sheep Dogs.

How enjoyable it is to sit around listening to some of Laurie's true experiences. Generally you talk of Dogs and Laurie has had them all, Labradors, English Pointers, Springer Spaniels, English Setters and Crossbreds, they all have a very warm meaning to Laurie.

An English Setter is well remembered, not so much for its capabilities, nor the tedious tasks of removing Burrs from its long hair, but rather for the time that the long hair saved the Setters life. On this occasion (a Quail Shoot), the Dog came running back to Laurie with a Tiger Snake hanging onto its ear, and Laurie frantically trying to keep away from it, eventually the Snake was shot and no ill-effects to the Dog, thanks to the long hair.

Another time his English Pointer was staunchly pointing Tussock, and Laurie decided to kick the game out which turned out to be a Copperhead Snake, the punctures of this one are still imprinted in the leather high-upper Boots he has kept for the record.

These were not the days of the Motor Cars and Deep-freeze, and Laurie's transport by this time had changed from Spring Cart to a Push-bike, with the English Pointer sitting on the crossbar, and his front feet resting on the Handlebars. This time last year I reported on the Club's activities in relation to our application to the Kennel Control Council for their approval to grant the Club permission to conduct two Test Trials for German Shorthaired Pointers and all Breeds of Gundogs that Hunt, Point and Retrieve.

On this occasion I wish to make special mention of both the conducting and the eventual outcome of these two Trials.

The Trials were very successfully concluded even though an extreme shortage of all types of Game prevailed, due to the severity of the recent drought. The endeavour, the hard work, the friendly relationship that fortunately exists between members of your Committee and cartain Land-owners made it possible for both Events to be run, and I might add run most efficiently.

Thus it is with a great deal of pleasure that I now inform all those members interested that the K.C.C. has granted the Club permission to conduct Field Trials for all Breeds of "Utility Dogs".

Rules and conditions have been drawn up by the K.C.C. Field Trial Advisory Committee, and these rules are to be adopted and adhered to for the next Two years.

Championship points will be awarded Winners and Place-getters in both Novice and Open Trials, and we will probably arrange a Championship Stake for the end of the season depending on the support and success we enjoy.

If at the end of the two year period we have found that any anomalies exist, or that improvement is desirable we shall have the opportunity to refer again to the K.C.C. Field Trial Advisory Committee for determination.

You will notice that I refer to the Trials as having been granted to "Breeds of Utility Gundogs" and this is very likely the terms in which competing dogs or breeds of dogs will be referred to.

Once again I say that this is a tremendous step forward for the Breeds we represent, I and my Committee have worked and battled to bring about the recognition we have at this stage achieved, now we need and want your support. Enter our Trials, attend our Functions and I'll guarantee you pleasure from your dog that you didn't know existed.

My grateful thanks I extend to those Members of the Field Trial Advisory Committee who were influential in bringing about the granting of these Trials to us, the interest, the consideration and thoughtfulness displayed by these men will be long appreciated, particularly to those individual members who accompanied us during our two Test Trials, those who took the trouble to find out as much as possible by studying the Rules and Methods of Judging adopted by the English Kennel Council for the English German Shorthair Club, and again those who actually shot over our Dogs to find out first hand the working capabilities of the Utility Gundog.

If all of the fore-going were the only achievement of the Club in 1968 then I would have considered it a most constructive year, however I'm happy to report that the Club has enjoyed an increase in membership, and the various Functions held during the year were very successful. Many Weimaraner Owners joined the Club and I extend to them a warm welcome on behalf of all our members, I hope you also attend and enjoy our Events and Social Gatherings, with your Breed of Utility Gundog, I feel we have a common goal.

THE BLACK AND WHITE GERMAN SHORTHAIRED POINTER:

Of recent times we have received requests for information regarding these dogs and the following notes, which give a precis of their origins, have been prepared for the information of Members:

In their formative years the German Shorthaired Pointer was the product of much experiment and cross-breeding until, in 1872, the Germans considered that they had evolved the type of gundog for which they were looking and Hoctor 1 was registered as No.1 in Volume 1 of the "Stammbuch Kurzhaar", the Studbook for the "Klub Kurzhaar fur kurzhaarige deutsche Vorstehhunde". In about 1908 Christian Bode, the breeder of the famous altenau strain carried out a breeding programme using a black pointer dog with the objective of improving pigmentation and sensitivity of nose. At the same time Dr. Wachter of the Wach prefix also bred on similar lines and the outcome was the black and white, or the "Prussian Blue" as the strain was then described. Controversy naturally followed but, finally, in 1924, it was agreed to have a sub-division in the Stud Book for these black and white dogs. In the 1925 Stammbuch Kurzhaar the definition of the black and white, or Prussian Blue, is "Schwarz, schwarzweiss, schwarzschimmel, sowie anders farbige hunde gleichen schwarzen blutes". In 1936 this sub-section of the Stud Book was discontinued and G.S.P.s of all permitted colours were registered in the Stud Book proper.

In Germany popularity of the Black and White was not great as they preferred to see the various shades of Brown and White dogs in their forests. But it was realised that by retaining the Black and White dogs it was possible to assure the much desired darker eye and one of these was used in matings approximately once in every five generations to achieve this purpose. In Italy the Black and White dogs were very welcome and in the Near East, and the Swiss also acquired this blood line. From the modern German Stud books it is reported that the Black registrations are on the increase.

The Americans imported G.S.P.s. after the 1914 - 1918 war before the Blacks were recognised in Germany and they have not altered their breed standards to comply with that of the country of origin. G.S.P.s were not imported into England in any numbers until after the 2nd World War. In 1951 two pure bred Black and ' .te G.S.P. bitches, both registered in Germany, were imported into this country - Diva v.d. Langen Heide and Edelgard v.d. Langen Heide and their pedigrees can be traced back to "Wach Luna", registered in Vol. 1. of the German Stud Book, Prussian Blue section. A Son of Edelgard's was also imported. These dogs were registered by the Kennel Club and were mated to Brown and Whites in this country producing some Brown and White and some Black and White puppies who were in turn registered by the Kennel Club. Thus we have the presence of our Black and White German Shorthaired Pointers of today.

No reference was made to the Breed Club at the time and the Kennel Club continued to accept such registration. Until 1963 the G.S.P. Club of this country made no mention of Black and White under the heading of colour in their standard. The question of accepting the Black and Whites arose and was referred to the Kennel Club who stated that these dogs had been accepted for registration in accordance with Berlin, Kennel Club practice. From 1963 onwards the Black and White markings have been included and published in the G.S.P. Standard in the Year Book. In 1964 a Black bitch was exhibited and won an award at Crufts.

The International standard of the Breed lodged in Brussels and issued by the Federation Cynologique Internationale includes Black and White in the permitted colours, reference No.119a. dated January 1964.

From these facts one can deduce that pure bred G.S.P.s whether Brown or Black and White in colouring have been accepted for the last forty years in their country or origin and other countries on the Continent. This example has been followed in this country but not in America.

Through the dogs imported directly after the War most G.S.P.s in England today can proudly claim relationship to such famous strains as Veronikaber, Hellerau, Radbach and Schlossgarten. All these Kennels produced outstanding dogs whose qualities were in no way diminished by carrying the Black blood. The fact that the Americans do not comply with the German standard or the International standard should not deter us if these dogs show the capacity for work, correct temperament and type and possibly improved nose and pigmentation which we require.

HISTORY OF THE G.S.P IN AUSTRALIA

Australia's first German Shorthairs were led off a Freighter at Port Melbourne in November 1962. They were Heathman of Friuli and Dunpender Eva. The purchaser and importer of these two fine dogs was Mr. Jack Thomson of Preston; Victoria, he had assigned the renowned Scottish Breeder and Trainer, Michael Brander, to locate and export the two finest animals he could find. Brander's choice was excellent, and the two original imports eventually became famous as winners in the Showring, and also in Field and Retreiving Trials against all breeds.

Jack Thomson founded "Dunfriu Kennels" on this pair. The Dunfriu line is mow one of the best known of all gundog sources in this country. Jack imported the G.S.P firstly as hunting companions; A keen hunter of all types of field game and water-fowl he had been unable to find the one type of dog to suit his needs as a "roughshooter", since many Australian (new & old) shooters are similarly inclined, the G.S.P quickly became popular.

Spectacular performance on the duck swamps, where shooting of wildfowl is carried out often in searing temperatures, was the first step. Onlookers saw the short-coated G.S.P outperforming the slower moving, heavier built Labradors, Curly Retrievers and suchlike simply because they were better equipped to withstand the above century conditions. Performances in the field, some times in even more stringent circumstances, were also crowd pleasers, and the G.S.P began to come in ahead of the English Pointers, Setters and the like in competitive Field Trials.

Within tree years, Heathman of Friuli (Monty to his admirers) and Dunpender Eva had amassed impressive scores and Championship points. By this time their offspring were commencing to show considerable promise also.

Jack was inundated with orders for puppies and in order to establish the Breed here he again looked overseas for new bloodlines. A trip across to New Zealand to survey that countrys stock availed little as those he saw failed to meet the standard he was determined to achieve.

Again he turned to the United Kingdom and brought out a number of dogs and bitches and succeeded in incorporating many of the foremost British bloodlines in his breeding.

Carefully bred puppies were now being distributed to all States and Territories of Australia, and a few were sent to New Zealand Interstate fanciers rapidly became enthusiastic and more imports were introduced into their breeding programs.

The solid livers then came on the scene and these too, quickly found favour in some quarters.

It is estimated that more than 3000 G.S.Ps are now owned in Australia. Jack Thomson gives Heathman of Friuli the lion's share of the credit for this rapid expansion of popularity. His almost inumerable wins in Field and Retreiving Trials, and the Showring have proven the breed's ability, at 16 months, Monty ran second in the nation's biggest Retrieving Trial, The Inter-Dominion, held in Victoria in 1963. He has since won an accumulation of Championship Retrieving Trial Points sufficient to make him a Champion Five Times Over.

At present there are thirty seven Australian Champions representing the breed, plus a number of C.D and C.D.X obedience winners. The most outstanding of these being the Best Exhibit in Show at the Perth Royal in 1968, Dunfriu Zeke, just eleven months old at the time, Another youngster deserving mention is Keefelea Zara, a Retrieving Trial Champion at seventeen months.

These records are past history and no doubt many future records will be made, but we feel that these "First of the Few" will always maintain a special niche in the History Of The Breed In Australia.

WHY DOCK THE TAIL?

There are various reasons why docking is done on a variety of dogs. Some breeds are of an exuberantly friendly disposition and the resultant vigorous tail-wagging led to a distinct headache when the kennelling problem was considered. These dogs weild a great deal of power and their tails were often split when coming into contact with the wire fencing or walls of their kennels.

It was found that the early G.S.Ps sustained injury of a similar nature when hunting in the field, particularly in heavy cover, and many dogs tails were stripped raw and bleeding because of the vigorous side to side movement of the tail as they were working.



RINGSIDE JUDGES

Perhaps many of our sportshooters-cum-exhibitors may find show ring experiences more rewarding and happier if we do a bit of positive thinking from the judges' point of view.

A lot of study is needed just to understand judging. Comments like "Can't the judge see those straight stifles", or roach back, or cow hocks, or other such remarks are foolish. These are the first basics learned by anyone interested in dogs. The commenter's dog may have had better stifles, but less bend is not straight, and there is such a thing as over angulation.

Occasionally a judge could, if unfamiliar with a new breed, overlook some requirement in the Standard that may be unusual or hard to understand, but such would not pass all judges.

The following is helpful advice from "The Nicholas Guide to Dog Judging":- "Some people evidently consider that the ability to fault a dog is all that it takes to make a judge. Quite the contrary. Actually, faulting a dog is one of the easiest things for a person with even very limited knowledge to accomplish.

Fault judging is negative judging, placing emphasis on undesirable rather than on the desirable features. Many fine qualities can be overlooked and unappreciated by a judge primarily engrossed in discovering faults. Knowledgeable judging is the ability to reconcile oneself to the fact that no perfect dog has yet been produced. Even the greatest winning dogs which have done most for their breeds can be faulted. Therefore, competent judges must place faults in their proper perspective, balancing the positive against the negative and never allowing a fault to dominate the picture to the extent that one's appreciation of a quality dog becomes distorted".

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir,

The following article was prompted by the frequent discussion and disagreement I have heard amongst dog owners on the subject of EGGS.

EGGS:- Good or Bad for Your Dog's Health?

Late in 1970 we found ourselves referred to the Werribee Veterinary Research Clinic for treatment for a bitch who had failed to produce after two services. The Specialist Veterinarian being a friendly, communicative fellow, I asked him the question - "Are eggs good for my dogs?" Not being sure of the answer himself, he asked another Veterinarian - a specialist in Nutrition. Her answer was that:-

- A. Raw eggs will not harm them.
- B. The yolk is definitely good for them.
- C. The albumen (clear material) cannot be absorbed raw and simply passes right through.
- D. If you wish your dog to have whole eggs (i.e. you are not a Pavlova fanatic), cook them for him.

If you wish verification for the foregoing I am sure you will find the staff at the Research Clinic as obliging and fastidious as we have. If you do find the necessity of partaking of their services, you will be as satisfied as we were (11 healthy pups).





When the dog locates the game he will bay until his master finds him, or otherwise he will return and lead his master back to the spot.





Always a hunter so interest in GSP's sparked when they first arrived on our shores. As could not keep a dog myself I was pleased my uncle and shooting mentor obtained a dog from what I believe may have been the second litter whelped in Australia. Some years later when involved in aboriginal affairs I met and become lifelong friends with David Hall. We shared an interest in GSP's. Still not able to have a dog I encourage David to take up an offer from Jack Thomson . Vorstehhund Eve (Imp NZ) arrived At David's and whelped her first litter for him under the Dunfriu prefix. Her next litter saw David and I keep a pup each both unfortunately met untimely deaths. Mated again to FT Ch Dunfriu Kaiser, Faye and I kept Dual Ch Deddick Tarshish. Her prefix chosen by David as he owned a parcel of natural bush between the Snowy and Deddick rivers in far NE Victoria. Instantly wanting to be breeders but not keen to mate Tarsh during her competitive years we purchased two older females in Ch Kurpfalz Eva and CH Shannondowns Fantails. These three bitches become our foundation and are behind all Canawindra's bred today. The prefix we chose "Canawindra" stems from my days as a youth leader with the ministry of aboriginal affairs. Told to me by a very young boy named Phillip Fenton, there has always been conjecture that it is after a NSW town, and is misspelt. "Canowindra" is also pronounced very differently. We don't think so but who cares anyway. Not even sure if this very young aboriginal boy had the meaning of the word correct but his interpretation struck a cord with me. He said it meant HOME but as the aboriginal people were nomadic, not a house or structure but more the place you were at, at any given time. Having had an interesting early life (takes a very long time to tell that story!!!!!), I moved around a lot and spent time with many different families. Forty Four years on Canawindra would be one of the oldest prefixes still breeding today.

Jack Thomson's prefix was hence derived from the first two imports into Australia Dun from Dunpender and friu from Friuli. Having bred just shy of 2000 pups this prefix may well never be surpassed as our most prolific. Apart from being the first importer of our breed Jack was responsible for many more notable imports. Irus von der Saarner Mark is no doubt the most influential having sired pups in Europe and then in England when he was caught up in a rabies scare and had to spend more than the normal amount of time in quarantine. He died prematurely from snake bite but not before making his mark in field and retrieving trials and leaving a number of siring sons. Behind a very large percentage of Australian dogs you may be surprised to find more than 10 crosses in the pedigree of your current dogs. Submitted by Mal Park

Fallohide

Established: 1988 Owner: Laurie Phelan

Home to Fallohide Leroy, Fallohide Omega

Before the crossing of the mountains the Hobbits had already become divided into three somewhat different breeds: Harfoots, Stoors, and Fallohides. The Harfoots were browner of skin, smaller, and shorter, and they were beardless and bootless; their hands and feet were neat and nimble; and they preferred highlands and hillsides. The Stoors were broader, heavier in build; their feet and hands were larger; and they preferred flat lands and riversides. The Fallohides were fairer of skin and also of hair, and they were taller and slimmer than the others; they were lovers of trees and of woodlands.

The Harfoots had much to do with Dwarves in ancient times, and long lived in the foothills of the mountains. They moved westward early, and roamed over Eriador as far as Weathertop while the others were still in Wilderland. They were the most normal and representative variety of Hobbit, and far the most numerous. They were the most inclined to settle in one place, and longest preserved their ancestral habit of living in tunnels and holes.

The Stoors lingered long by the banks of the Great River Anduin, and were less shy of Men. They came west after the Harfoots and followed the course of the Loudwater southwards; and there many of them long dwelt between Tharbad and the borders of Dunland before they moved north again.

The Fallohides, the least numerous, were a northerly branch. They were more friendly with Elves than the other Hobbits were, and had more skill in language and song than in handicrafts; and of old they preferred hunting to tilling. They crossed the mountains north of Rivendell and came down the River Hoarwell. In Eriador they soon mingled with the other kinds that had preceded them, but being somewhat bolder and more adventurous, they were often found as leaders or chieftains among clans of Harfoots or Stoors. Even in Bilbo's time the strong Fallohidish strain could still be noted among the greater families, such as the Tooks and the Masters of Buckland.

Soon to be joined by Jack's imported bitch Tainui Gerda. Early litters were bred under the Dunfriu prefix with the Beard's first litter under their own prefix arriving in 1967 from Kurt and Klare. Followed in 1968 with a Linstan litter from Gerda. Many believe the vast majority of our good working stock comes down from Gerda.

Bob was of course R S Beard officially and Lyn nearly always referred to him by his second name "STAN" hence the combination of their names forming LINSTAN kennels.

Not prolific breeders but producing many notable winners in a variety of fields.

Linstan Keene won four Melbourne Royal challenges and two reserves in the days before we had Best Of Breed awarded. The year Keene was on the brink of a record fifth win a young man turned up with a pup. He nor the pup had previously shown, Bob took them aside and gave a quick lesson or two only to have them steal away keene's record breaking win. Such was the worth of this lovely couple to the foundation of our breed in this country.

The prefix was returned solely to Mark Nielsen at around November 1998. Maree Pledger has used the prefix on a couple of times when she moved back to her homeland of Tasmania in 1991

The prefix was officially registered and used to breed firstly GSP's in Jan 1985 and then Large Munsterlanders within a week of the shorthairs. The prefix has also been used to register 2 litters of pointers and 3 litters of Weimeraners.

There are dogs with the Trupoint prefix that have been shown and competed very successfully in the field and obedience rings in all states of Australia and over the ditch in Tasmania as well.

Trupoint can be found in many pedigrees of top winning dogs in Australia, America, England and New Zealand.
